RAPIDS PROGRAM COMING TO FAIRMOUNT

Don't miss the July 28th Association meeting for a special gift to take home with you. Guest speaker Eartha Pitre from the Fort Worth Police Departments Crime prevention office, will be demonstrating the latest crime fighting tool RAPIDS (Recovered Auto Parts ID System).

RAPIDS is a property-marking program from the Fort Worth Police Department. It is designed to aid in the prevention of burglary thefts and assist in recovery of stolen property. The identification number is encoded into a barcode format and printed on a small label. The



innocuous barcode labels will contain either the property owner's driver's license number or vehicle VIN. These labels are difficult to remove once placed on property. If property is found with the RAPIDS label, it can be scanned and traced back to its owner.

Labels will be made on the spot by just scanning your driver's license at the Fairmount meeting. Your license number will not appear on the label, just as a bar code. Attaching these innocent-looking bar codes to the backs of TVs, DVRs, lawn mowers, stereos, or just about anything, can help recover stolen property.

PROPOSED BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

The FNA bylaws committee has proposed the following changes to the FNA bylaws to be voted on by the membership at the July 28 meeting:

- Move the following areas of responsibility from the Director of Promotions to the Director of Historic Preservation:
 - Keep a scrapbook of the history of the Fairmount Neighborhood and make research available upon request.
 - Be responsible for maintaining research into the history of the Fairmount Neighborhood and its houses.

The committee feels this is no longer reflective of the Director of Promotions and belongs with the Director of Historic Preservation.

- 2. Move the following area of responsibility from the Director of Infrastructure to the Director of Promotions:
 - Act as a liaison to neighborhood businesses.

We feel that the relationships with local businesses is more in line with Promotions as Infrastructure deals more with things within the defined area of Fairmount and most of the businesses are outside the defined areas. In addition, the relationship makes more sense with Promotions as the relationship would likely revolve around donations or other support to the neighborhood which Infrastructure doesn't really deal with.



Call to Order 7:00 p.m.

Minutes of the last meeting -7:00-7:05

Sean and Sara Lynch - Fairmount Members Happy Hour. Rotate a happy hour for residents at local restaurants, bars or homes once a month.

Directors' Reports - 7:05 - 7:25

- Director of Infrastructure Robert. Street light update. Ordered two speed bumps for Fairmount and Lipscomb. Adopt Allen update.
- Director of Administration Serena. Looking into park sign and trashcans for Fairmount Park.
- Director of Historic Preservation Sue. Cases on agenda: Joe Frank building house at 1958 Lipscomb. Same style as one on 2200 block of 6th Avenue. 2240 College garage apartment request. 2112 College request. Request to demolish Tiny Mart and request for the proposed house that will go there. - Of special note: any door vendor who knocks on your door must have permit card issued from the city. Ask to see it.
- Illegal dumping update given by Officer Phillip Van Horn. If you see someone dumping call 911. Fine is \$1100 to \$2000. Tire dumping is big right now. Get as much information as you can like the license plate, car color, description of person. Roofing, tiles, bags, any illegal dumping or chronic hot spots, please call Phillip at 817-944-6943 or phillip.vanhorn@fortworthgov.org.

Program: Beth Knight, Senior Planner, City of Fort Worth Planning Department 7:30 - 8:00

- Background information: Fairmount currently has several types of zoning. Our historic overlay protects us to some
 degree from development we may not want but it may not protect us enough. In the past, a Fairmount committee
 was formed and recommended to council a special single family zoning with a secondary dwelling option. Other
 neighborhoods in Fort Worth were not supportive for fear developers/homeowners might use this zoning as a loophole to develop unwanted granny flats and rentals in their neighborhoods.
- As a neighborhood, we need to decide if we want granny flats or not. If we do, Beth's recommendation for Fairmount would be to create a special PD (planned development) zoning district for Fairmount. It would be exclusive to Fairmount. Under a PD overlay we would write our own zoning. We could borrow some of the ideas recommended in the past such as, a granny flat would need to be a detached unit. It could not be more than 30% the size of the main dwelling. There would need to be a parking spot for everyone. No paving over front yards for parking. Off the alley access is a possibility. Once we decide what we want we could then request a council initiated zoning change.

Outside Your Old House

We're moving into the dog days of summer. It may only have been 102° but with the Heat Index it felt like 108°. There are only two jobs that are consistent this time of year: water, water, water and mulch, mulch, mulch. If you bag your grass clippings, dump them on your garden beds. If you don't, buy shredded pine bark or hardwood mulch. Add some extra nitrogen fertilizer to offset what the mulch uses as it breaks down and put up to 3 inches of mulch in your garden beds. Planting or transplanting this time of year is iffy. It can be done but will take lots of extra care—and Medina Plus daily on roots and leaves.

If your tomatoes have hit the summer doldrums, you've got a couple of choices. In past years, I've found that fall vegetables are slim pickings in the nurseries and had some decent luck cutting my tomatoes back to just above the first good joint (6" to 12" depending on the plant) and keeping them watered. A couple of years ago I had tomatoes thru the first two frosts.

Many of your perennials will continue to bloom thru until frost if you'll be consistent with deadheading; coneflower, canna, plumbago, scabiosa. crape myrtle, agastache and salvia are among them. They look a little peaked right now but keep deadheading and watering and they'll give you a great show when the weather cools.



Prepare your vegetable beds for fall—broccoli and cauliflower, brussel sprouts and many of the lettuces do better in the fall than the spring. Start your seed by the first of August. I'm pretty underwhelmed with the seed selection at Lowe's and Home Depot so I go back to my Burpees and Park catalogs and read the harvest information to choose my seed. If you can harvest before Thanksgiving, you can plant it here.
