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Diana Koch, our current Home Tour Docent-Wrangler, spends the rest of the year restoring houses. This one at 1819 6th had been remuddled and bricked-over to look like the first photo but probably originally looked more like the second, as it does now. Diana is currently working on another house at 1954 Lipscomb that has had a couple of prior restoration attempts.



David Robinson lives in Fairmount and has been restoring Fairmount for a number of years now. His successes include 1701 and 1601 College, 1711 6th, 1924 Hurley, and this house at 1727 Washington. Shown here burned and abandoned in 1995 (sitting next to another burned house that was bulldozed), restoration begun by Ralph Watterson in early 2000's, then completed by David in 2007. Its property value increased from \$25,000 to \$141,000 in 5 years.

JANUARY YARD OF THE MONTH 1013 HAWTHORNE

This month we honor as Yard of the Month the landscape enhancing the charming home of Susan Stewart and Michael Hiatt.

A pair of live oaks spread their branches adjacent to the sidewalk creating a welcome bit of separation between the yard and the street. From the sidewalk to the porch, the front walkway is lined with beds overflowing with variegated liriopse and a colorful mix of both purple and green ornamental cabbage as well as pansies in yellow and burgundy.

A pair of crepe myrtles frames the porch railing, which is lined with a row of boxwood shrubs, while roses climb trellises at the end. On the porch, a pair of rosemary topiaries stands at either side of the front door. A porch swing, metal table and variety of wicker furnishings, all painted white and topped with red and white cushions, create a cozy seating area. Wind chimes, white plates hung from red ribbon, and the silk flowers wrapping the chains of the swing provide whimsical decorative touches.

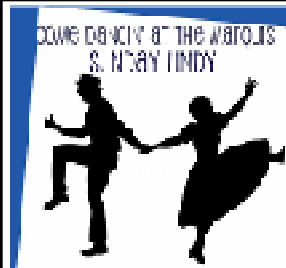

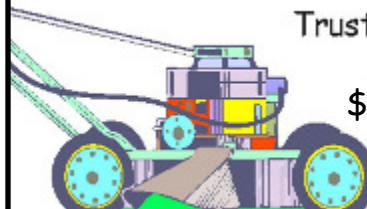

My goal is to find all the locations and have them reported and then abated as soon as possible. For this to happen I need everyone's help to report these locations and to call 911 immediately if you see tagging in progress. This call has been up graded by our dispatch system. All city property will be reported and abated as quickly as possible contact number is 817-212-2700, or e-mail directly to Dionna.Zamora@fortworthgov.org to get on the abatement list.

Graffiti reports can be taken over the phone to avoid dispatching police officers to the scene; however, photo image is not available on report, so details are crucial. On line citizen report system www.fortworthpd.com/coplignic/start-report.html is available to also assist citizens make police report on line, it will accept 2 photo images. Graffiti@fortworthgov.org inter-net web-site is available and accessible to give addresses of graffiti sites or any pertinent information to follow-up with abatement of locations as quickly as possible. www.469tips.com is another source to give out to citizens and remain anonymous when reporting gun or gang crime tips such as taggers/gang members addresses or hang out locations; in addition to the Crime Stoppers reward.
